

To Trick or Treat OR not to Trick or Treat – that is the question?

As we all know, this is going to be a different Halloween this year. One thing that remains the same is that trick or treating should be safe and fun experience.

Each municipality decides their hours at a monthly meeting. The Sharon Board annually reviewed the day and time at our September meeting. Based on the local pandemic conditions, trick or treating is a personal decision and even though our township has appointed the time for this event, it does not encourage participation or provide permission to do so.

For those going trick or treating, avoid going door to door in groups. It is recommended for participants to stick with their own household members. All participants should wear face coverings and social distance with those outside their household and not crowd on porches.

For those wanting to pass out candy, it is highly recommended to place the candy in a bucket or table on the porch. No in-person contact is recommended.

For those NOT wanting to pass out candy, turn your porch light off. Trick or treaters should also respect those who have their lights turned off.

As a rule of thumb, large gatherings or events are still not recommended and if anyone from your household is feeling sick, please have them stay home.
